Society of Critical Care Medicine in collaboration with UNIMED and UNIMED **Teaching Hospital Trains Paediatricians** and Emergency Room Physicians

Society of Critical Care Medicine in collaboration with the University of Medical Sciences and University of Medical Sciences Teaching Hospital, Ondo City, Ondo State organised a training tagged "Paediatric Fundamental Critical Care Support Course (PFCCS)" for paediatricians and emergency room physicians between 3rd and 5th July, 2024 at the University's Simulation Laboratory.





The training, which had 35 participants in attendance, aimed to improve the skills of Paediatricians and General Practitioners involved in the care of children, served as a continuous medical education for medical professionals; and aimed to build capacity for paediatric critical care professionals in the country. The training was facilitated by Emeritus Professor Olugbenga Akingbola of Paediatrics Critical Care, Tulane University School of Medicine, New Orleans, LA, USA and Dr Abimbola Akindolire, Consultant, Paediatric Intensive Care Unit, University College Hospital, Ibadan.

In attendance at the opening ceremony were the DVC, Academics, Professor Roseangela Nwuba and the CMD, UNIMEDTHC, Dr Gbala Michael.

This edition of the training was the 4th one held by the University of Medical Sciences and UNIMEDTHC.




UNIMED Formally Inaugurates First Students' Representatives Council

The University of Medical Sciences (UNIMED), Ondo City, Ondo State formally inaugurated the Students' Representatives of Council (SRC) the institution on Saturday, 6th 2024 at **TETFund** July, Lecture Theatre, Laje Road Campus. The inauguration, which bestowed seal of authority on the SRC, came after a keenly contested election that took place a week earlier. During the inauguration. the Vice Chancellor of the University Prof. Adesegun Fatusi stressed that he derived his leadership strength from the positions he held as a student union member while he was in school.

According to him, " one of the happiest things I took away from the University of Ife is not certificate but the my experience I gathered from the various positions I held. I held about 9 positions which contribute to my leadership skills ". He further stressed his belief in student unionism and the advised new representatives to be well cultured, dress well and to talk responsibly. He submitted that "I don't believe in rubber stamp union, but the way you lead matters. Speak when you are to speak and act when you are to act. The way you go about a situation determines the outcome. I will organise a team that will give you leadership training".











Speaking at the event, the Dean of Students' Affairs, Dr. Evelyn Salewa Osho admonished the representatives not to turn the students union into thuggery but to behave well and care about the welfare of students and management. In her words, "the school had been doing well without student unionism and can still exist without a union. You are not the best. You were only privileged to be elected into this position. In other schools, when you say students' union it is a gathering of thugs. In UNIMED, it should be the gathering of well behaved. intellectual and highly innovative people. Discharge your duties well and in time, care about the welfare of your fellow students and management " she said. Prof Remi Duyile, a guest from Bowen State University, U.S.A, admonished the Union to be dutiful and be well behaved. Electoral Officer, Akerele Goodness, presented an award of excellence to the Vice Chancellor, the Dean of Students' Affairs and the Students' Affairs Officer. The event had parents and members of staff in attendance.



POST UTME/DIRECT ENTRY ADMISSION SCREENING FOR THE 2024/2025 ACADEMIC SESSION

The University of Medical Sciences (UNIMED), Ondo State is the First (1st) Specialized Medical and Health Sciences institution in West Africa. Since its establishment in 2014, the University has carved a niche by being one of the few public universities with stable uninterrupted academic calendar exceptional quality educational service delivery.

According to NUC Ranking (2021), the University was ranked first (1st) among Ondo State-Owned Universities, 2nd best of all Public & Private Universities in Ondo State, 4th among all State-Owned Universities in Nigeria, and 19th Best University in Nigeria.

ELIGIBILITY

- 1. Candidates who chose "Ondo State University of Medical Sciences" as their most preferred (1st) Choice Institution in the 2024 UTME and scored 150 and above are eligible to apply for the Post UTME Screening.
- 2. All applicants are required to have a minimum of five (5) credits in either WAEC, NECO and GCE O' Level, which must include English Language, Mathematics and any other three (3) relevant subjects as may be specified by each Faculty. The five (5) O'Level credits should be obtained in not more than two (2) sittings.
 - For Medicine and Surgery, Dentistry and Doctor Physiotherapy programmes, the five (5) O'Level credits must include Mathematics, English, Biology, Chemistry & Physics which must be obtained at only one (1) sitting.
- 3. Direct Entry candidates who have already applied through JAMB and also picked the University as their most preferred (1st) Choice Institution in the 2024 Direct Entry Registration are also eligible to apply for the Post UTME Screening.
 - They are required to possess a minimum of ten (10) points in relevant 'A' level subjects, B.Sc. (Hons) Degree with a minimum of Second Class (Lower Division)/Diploma in the Basic Medical or Basic Science subjects with a minimum of Lower Credit;
 - for Medicine and Surgery and Dentistry programmes, a minimum of thirteen (13) points in relevant 'A' level subjects, and Second Class Upper, B.Sc. (Hons) Degree in any Basic Medical Science courses:
 - for the Nursing Science programme, candidates with a first (1st) degree in health-related and basic science courses with a minimum of Second Class Lower Honours; also candidates who are holders of the RN or RM Certificates from the Nursing and Midwifery Council of Nigeria are also eligible to apply.

- 4. JAMB UTME Subject Combination: All courses in the various Faculties require English Language, Biology, Chemistry and Physics. Candidates applying for admission in Mathematics, Physics, Statistics, or Computer Science are required to present a UTME subject combination of English Language, Mathematics, Physics, and Chemistry.
- 5. Note that candidates who did not choose the "Ondo State University of Medical Sciences" and are willing to change to this University as their most preferred (1st) choice Institution are also advised to apply for the Post UTME Screening.

HOW TO APPLY FOR THE 2024 POST UTME SCREENING:

Eligible candidates should log on to the University website www.unimed.edu.ng and take the following steps:

- · Click on Admission;
- Click on Post-UTME to access the Post-UTME Portal;
- Click on PAYMENT to make payment via the online payment system using VISA or MASTER Card. Note that: VERVE Card is not allowed;
- · After payment, Print the Payment Receipt
- On Post-UTME Portal, Click on Application Portal to Login with your UTME Registration Number and Payment Transaction ID as Password to complete the Post-UTME registration.

Direct Entry Candidates are to request for their Official Academic Transcripts from their previous institution which must be forwarded directly to the Registrar, University of Medical Sciences, Ondo, through the following address: Office of the Registrar, University of Medical Sciences, Laje Campus, Ondo City.

(Direct Entry applicants will not be considered for admission without evidence of submission of official academic transcripts to the above address)
