The Governing Council of the University of Medical Sciences, Ondo City, Ondo State, at its 23rd Meeting held on Thursday, 22nd August, 2024, approved the appointment of Mr. Ezekiel Imoleayo Adeniran as the 3rd substantive Registrar of the institution.

Mr. Adeniran is a seasoned administrator with over 16 years of cognate experience in university administration. He has worked in the Federal, State and Private Universities, which made him to be well grounded in the administration of universities with different proprietorial fundings.

The newly appointed Registrar, Mr. Adeniran, holds a Master's Degree in Health Law & Policy from the University of Medical Sciences, Ondo City, Ondo State, Master's Degree in Business Administration in Human Resource Management & General Management and Diploma in Leadership and Business Management both from the University of Southern Queensland, Australia and a B.Sc. UNIMED REVEALS THE QUALITY OF AIR IN ONDO ... Says dry season will extend to March, advises government and citizens on safety measures

The outcome of a research conducted by researchers at the University of Medical Sciences (UNIMED), Ondo in the latter part of 2024 has revealed the quality of air in Ondo, Ondo State.

The research conducted by Oluwajenrola Akintomide, Christopher Olowookere, and Roseangela Nwuba in conjunction with IQAir in the USA, shows “there was moderate air quality in August, September, and October, while in the dry months of November and December, the ambient air was unhealthy to the sensitive groups and unhealthy to the general public. The air quality exceeded the WHO-recommended limit of 50”.

The study was conducted using a ground-based observatory at the University of Medical Sciences Ondo, Odosida Campus, Nigeria. Real-time data on ambient air quality was monitored from August to December 2024

The big data was downloaded and analysed using Python analytical tools.

According to the lead researcher, Oluwajenrola Akintomide, “the dry season in Ondo, Southwest of Nigeria, is expected to extend to March 2025. Therefore, the general public in Ondo and other locations in Nigeria should protect themselves from the increased particulate matter concentrations and temperature values associated with the dry season”. The researchers suggested that individuals should among others, “use facemasks in the dry season, especially at the pollution hotspots, drink more water to avoid dehydration, cover their heads with protective headgear, especially in the afternoon, sprinkle water on house ground and office floor outdoors before sweeping it, etc.

and transmitted to cloud storage In addition, the researchers recommended that government should organise public enlightenment programmes on the adverse health effects of air pollution and the safety precautionary measures; improve the current economic situation in the nation; tar all road networks in Ondo and, by extension, Nigeria, to reduce road dust; introduce mass transit bus to reduce motorcycle density on the highway, among other solutions.

NEW YEAR MESSAGE OF THE VICE-CHANCELLOR OF THE UNIVERSITY OF MEDICAL SCIENCES (UNIMED), ONDO, NIGERIA, PROFESSOR ADESEGUN OLAYIWOLA FATUSI, FNAMED, FAS

Dear all,

Happy New Year. Welcome to the year 2025: A year of definitive change and possibilities!

As I contemplated this message, a verse from the Bible came to mind encapsulating our experience in 2024. I crave the indulgence of all, particularly my non-Christian colleagues, to quote this bible verse .

"I know your deeds. See, I have placed before you an open door that no one can shut. I know that you have little strength, yet you have kept my word and have not denied my name. I will make those who are of the synagogue of Satan, who claim to be Jews though they are not, but are liars –I will make them come and fall down at your feet..."

-Revelation 3: 8-9 (Emphasis mine)

In 2024, God truly availed us of "open doors," which enabled us to record several feats including the commencement of our Doctor of Pharmacy programme with the admission of the first cohort of students. We also admitted our first cohort for Bachelor of Speech Therapy programme. We confronted the issue of accreditation of our Bachelor of Radiography and Radiation Science programme with purchase of essential equipment and recruitment of new staff. In December 2024, we received the gift of a 6-building Guest House. Against all odds and for the first time, the convocation was held at our

main campus on the 12th of December 2024. We completed our new health centre complex, in 2024. In the same year, UNIMED and His Excellency, Governor Lucky Aiyedatiwa commissioned it on Friday, 13th of December 2024. That same day, the Governor also laid the foundation of the Senate building at the main campus.. At the special convocation ceremony of 13th December 2024, we awarded our first set of honorary degrees and his Imperial Majesty, Osemawe & paramount ruler of Ondo Kingdom. Oba Dr Victor Adesimbo Kiladejo Jilo III, CFR was installed as the first Chancellor of the university. These are just a few of the significant achievements of the university in 2024.

Unfortunately, we also experienced the work of the "accuser" and his agents in no small measure, through attempts to blackmail, false petitions, and campaigns of calumny against the university and its leadership. The accuser, true to character, "has nothing to do with the truth, and there is no truth in him; When he lies, he speaks out of his own character, for he is a liar and the father of lies." God however helped us as a community to focus on the vision and mission rather than these distractions.

Indeed, the Lord, in His mercy, turned the counsel and campaigns of calumny to nought and it could not stop the advancement of the university!

Among others, for the first time, we admitted over 1,000 students in 2024. In the same year, UNIMED was honoured by the state government, through the Office of the Head of Service, with the distinguished Public Service Award. The celebration of the 10th Anniversary of the University in December 2024 showed the power of strategic focus, commitment, and unity. It demonstrated to the world what we could achieve when each contributes his/her quota to the collective aspirations of the University. The anniversary turned out to be a crowning moment of the University's glory in the last one decade! Indeed, teamwork makes the dream work!

As we remain focused on our vision and mission, we are rapidly approaching the finishing line of this administration. I am deeply grateful to God for what He had enabled us to accomplish in the life of this institution over the short period of less than 5 years! I took up this assignment at a time



when the future of this institution was uncertain with the staff owed 5 months' salary and morale very low. There were only a few buildings available for lectures and offices for staff (academic and administrative) and the infrastructure was quite inadequate.

In the ensuing period, with the help of God, prudent financial management and commitment of a cadre of dedicated staff, we built on the formidable foundation laid through thick and thin by the first Vice Chancellor, Prof Friday Okonofua. Today we have set the University on the path of a solid and assured future. In the past 5 years, the number of undergraduate courses more than tripled (from 12 to 40), and the postgraduate programme now has 60 courses, including 23 PhDs and a novel and unique Executive MBA in Health Management was launched towards the end of December 2024.

A bold and strategic resource generation and resource optimization strategy has radically transformed the financial prospects and viability of UNIMED. We have established Nigeria's first full-fledged School of Public Health, and also established four new Faculties (Pharmacy, Medical Rehabilitation, Health Law and Humanities),

and Multidisciplinary Studies), along with three new Institutes, 20 new departments, and 15 inter-disciplinary academic centres. We have also established two new campuses (the Main Campus and Bolorunduro).

Close to 30 new buildings have been added to the university real estate, with about half fully or partially funded from our internally generated revenue. This has not been by our power and might, but by the grace of God working through human agencies; We thank all destiny helpers, including trustworthy and committed staff, who had stood and laboured side-by-side with us towards advancing the UNIMED brand.

As I reflect on my experience from March 2020 and look forward to my departure imminent from UNIMED, I am filled with hope for the future of UNIMED. I am also conscious that while it takes a lot of efforts to build and grow institutions, it takes only a very short time and very little effort to pull down what has been painstakingly built for years and destroy a promising future – and it does not require more than few mischievous individuals to do so.

To quote the Greek philosopher Plato, "Any man may easily do harm, but not every man can do good to another."

Thus, as 2025 marks the beginning of the third quinquennium of the institution and the threshold of a new administration, the year presents the critical stakeholders of the institution, of which the staff constitute a core group, a blank cheque to determine the future course of the institution. Will UNIMED continue on its trajectory of progressive and amazing growth or start on a pathway of reversal, decline and destruction? The choice is largely in the hands of the staff.

Thus, I urge every staff to stay committed to the dream of building a greater institution. Stand for the truth and refuse to be part of falsehood that has become a stock-in-trade of many. Finally, I earnestly plead that you wholeheartedly support the next Vice-Chancellor and his/her administration.

May 2025 be a year of great harvest from the throne of grace for all you dare to sow.

2024/2025 SESSION**

Applications are invited from suitably qualified candidates for admission into the University of Medical Sciences, B.Sc. Conversion Programmes under the Institute of Distance Learning and Continuing Education, Akure Campus.

General Requirements for All UNIMED B. Sc. Conversion Programmes

1. A candidate for B.Sc. Conversion Programme in UNIMED must have obtained 5 credit passes in the following O'Level Subjects: English Language, Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry and Biology in WAEC / NECO/GCE in not more than two (2) sittings.
2. Evidence of NYSC discharge/exemption certificate.
3. Academic/Official transcripts must be processed and mandatorily provided before admission. An electronic copy of the official transcript can be forwarded to: idlce transcripts@unimed.edu.ng

The following are the available courses under the various faculties:

FACULTY OF DENTAL SCIENCES

B. Sc. Conversion Programme in Dental Therapy (BDent T)

Programme Duration – 6 semesters

Admission Requirement

- All candidates for admission to the B Dental Therapy degree by conversion must possess the following:
- Higher National Diploma (HND) certificate with minimum of upper credit
- The candidate must also obtain satisfactory pass at any further examination conducted by the University.

B. Sc. Conversion Programme in Dental Technology

Programme Duration – 6 semesters

Admission Requirements

- All candidates for admission to the B. Sc (Dental Technology) degree by conversion must possess Higher National Diploma (HND) in Dental Technology with minimum of lower credit pass.
- Candidate must also obtain satisfactory pass at any further examination conducted by the University.

FACULTY OF MEDICAL REHABILITATION

B. Sc. Conversion Programme in Health Information Management (HIM)

Admission Requirements

- Candidates shall be holders of Higher National Diploma (HND) in Health Information Management from recognized and accredited training schools.
- Candidates must possess evidence of participation in the NYSC (discharge certificate) or certificate of exemption from the scheme.

Duration of Programme: Two (2) years, 3 semesters per year

FACULTY OF PHYSIOTHERAPY

Admission into Transitional-Doctor of Physiotherapy

Admission Requirements for 18 months duration (3 semesters)

- Candidate must have obtained a first degree- BSc PT, BMR PT, BPT from a 4 or 5 year training programme within or outside Nigeria.
- Candidates shall possess a minimum of second class lower division in BSc PT, BMR (PT) or BPT.
- Candidates with Third Class degree in Physiotherapy but with additional Postgraduate National Diploma certificate in any relevant fields can also be offered admission into the 18-months duration programme.
- Candidates must possess a current MRTB practicing license.

Admission Requirements for 12 months duration (2 semesters)

- The candidate must satisfy the minimum requirements as stipulated for the 18 months programme but must have additional postgraduate qualification(s) with a minimum of MSc in physiotherapy or relevant fields (MPH, MSc in Exercise science or Physiology, Physiology, Anatomy and Biochemistry).
- Candidates must possess a current MRTB practicing license.

B. PO. Conversion Programme in Prosthetics and Orthotics

Admission Requirements

- Candidates shall possess a minimum of Higher National Diploma (HND) in Prosthetics and Orthotics Technology from Recognized / approved Institution with a minimum of lower credit).
- Candidates must possess a current MRTB practicing license.

Duration of Programme: six (6) semesters.

FACULTY OF SCIENCE

B. Sc. Conversion Programme in Computer Science

Admission Requirements

- An applicant seeking admission into University of Medical Sciences, Ondo City, conversion programme must be an HND (Computer Science, Information Technology, Mathematics, Statistics, Physics, Physics Electronics

Core Engineering: Civil, Mechanical, Electrical & Electronics) holder with a minimum of lower credit. Applicants who obtained a third class degree in any university recognized by Nigerian University Commission (NUC), can apply. Also, applicants with B. Ed Computer Science can as well apply (a minimum of Second Class Lower Division).

B. Sc. Conversion Programme in Microbiology

Admission Requirements

- Applicants must possess an HND Certificate with a minimum of Lower Credit or a Bachelor's Degree with a minimum of a Pass in a related discipline from a recognized university or polytechnic.

Duration: 2 years, 3 Semesters per year.

B. Sc. Conversion Programme in Physics

Areas of specialization: (i) Physics (ii) Physics with Electronics (iii).Medical Physics

Admission requirements

An applicant must possess any of the following:

- Higher National Diploma (HND) in Physics with Electronics, Electrical/Electronics with Lower credit
- Bachelor of .Science (B. Sc) with a Third Class degree in any recognized University
- Bachelor of Technology (B.Tech) or Bachelor of Engineering (B.Eng) in Electrical/Electronic with Third Class degree
- Bachelor of Education (B.Ed) in Integrated Science with a minimum of Second Class Lower division.

B. Sc. Conversion Programme in Science Laboratory Technology (SLT)

The options available are:

(i) Biochemistry Techniques (ii) Biology and Computational Biology Techniques (iii) Chemistry Techniques (iv) Industrial Mathematics and Statistics Techniques (iv) Microbiology Techniques (v) Physics with Electronics Techniques

Admission Requirements

- Candidates must possess a Minimum of Pass or Third Class Honours or HND (minimum of Lower Credit grade) from a recognized Institution.
