Earlier, the vice chancellor of the university, Prof Adesegun Fatusi, said a total of 634 students were graduating.

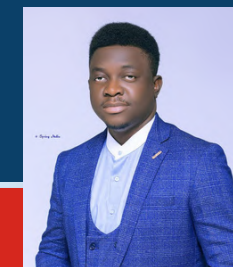
## FROM THE EDITOR

## EX-GOV MIMIKO GETS OVATION AT UNIMED CONVOCATION

Former governor of Ondo State, Dr. Olusegun Mimiko, was the cynosure of all eyes at the convocation ceremony of the University of Medical Sciences (UNIMED), Ondo, yesterday as he bagged a Master's degree in Health Law and Policy.

The 70-year-old former governor who enrolled for the master's degree programme at the university had bagged his first degree in Medicine and Surgery over 40 years ago from the Obafemi Awolowo University (OAU), Ile-Ife.

Mimiko, who was adjudged the best M.Sc graduating student in Health Law and Policy received the Oluwarotimi Akeredolu prize for the best student in Master of Health Law and Policy.

Mimiko, who established the university 10 years ago while serving as the governor, said he was glad to see the institution achieving high feats as it has produced three sets of medical doctors within 10 years. He said the university has enjoyed an uninterrupted academic programme due to the commitment, dedication and resilience of the management of the institution.

Governor Lucky Aiyedatiwa has assured that his administration will continue to prioritise education and health because they are fundamental to sustainable development.

# 34 BAG FIRST CLASS AS UNIMED GRADUATES 634 STUDENTS

No fewer than 634 students on Thursday graduated from the University of Medical Sciences (UNIMED), Ondo State, during the institution's 6th convocation.

With 34 of the graduates bagging first class, 539 students will graduate from the institution's first degree, 95 will emerge from the postgraduate programmes, and 127 students will be graduating with unclassified degrees.

While disclosing this during the convocation ceremony, the Vice-Chancellor of the institution, Prof. Adesegun Fatusi, revealed that those with unclassified degrees consist of 41 medical doctors, 23 dental surgeons, and 64 physiotherapists.

According to Fatusi, the research portfolio of the university has expanded within the last five years as well as focus on community development initiatives.

He said, "This convocation marks the first time that UNIMED will be awarding its honorary degree, and the calibre of people for whom our Senate and Council have approved the award speaks volumes of its import. There are five awardees who cut across the three geographical regions of our country, including two women.

"This convocation is my last as the vice-chancellor of this university, and it signifies the end of the tenure of the second administration in the history of this fast-growing institution as I complete my tenure in the first quarter of 2025.

"UNIMED has produced three sets of medical doctors, three sets of dentists, four sets of nurses, four sets of physiotherapists,



two sets of medical laboratory scientists, and six sets of graduates of various health sciences programs in just 10 years of existence. This is a remarkable feat in Nigeria's history."

Meanwhile, the former governor of the state, Olusegun Mimiko clinched the Arakunrin Oluwarotimi Odunayo Akeredolu prize for the best graduating student in Master of Health Law and Policy.

# EX-OAU VC CALLS FOR STATE OF EMERGENCY IN EDUCATION

## ... As Varsity Graduates 634 Students

Former Vice-Chancellor of Obafemi Awolowo University (OAU), Ile-Ife, Prof. Bamitale Omole, has called for an immediate declaration of a state of emergency in the nation's education sector.

To this end, the former Vice-Chancellor tasked governments at all levels to invest more in education, as all the development indices of the country centre on the education sector.

Additionally, Prof. Omole urged political office holders in the country to release part of their salaries and allowances for the development of the education sector.

The former Vice-Chancellor expressed worry over the budgetary allocation of the federal government to the education sector since independence, which he said is below the 20% recommended by the United Nations.

Delivering the 10th anniversary lecture of the Ondo State-owned University of Medical Sciences (UNIMED), Ondo, on Wednesday, Prof. Omole noted that only a few states in the country prioritise the education of their people, as shown in their budgetary allocations, while others show little concern.

The former Vice-Chancellor spoke on "The Leviathan Debacle: Re-imagining University Education in Nigeria in an Age of Governmental Backsliding."

According to the don, ineptitude and indifference from governments at all levels have almost destroyed the nation's education sector.

He said the budgetary allocation to the education sector from 1960 to date is not encouraging, hence the need for the government to show more interest in the sector.

The former Vice-Chancellor attributed the poor technical know-how and lack of professionals in many fields to the government's lack of interest in education, as reflected in the poor funding of the sector.

Omole stated that "Taiwan, Indonesia, Malaysia, and Singapore have channelled a huge percentage of their budgets to education" and advised the federal government to borrow a leaf from these countries. According to him, these nations are more developed due to their interest in education. The development of the education sector, he said, will lead to the development of the socio-economic status of the country and bring about progress in all sectors of the economy. "A nation that forsakes the education of the people will be backward in all areas of life. For a nation to be developed, there's the need to develop the education sector,

as education is the bedrock of transformation in life," he stressed.

He added that "education brings enlightenment and civilization of minds, hence the need for the government to concentrate on the development of the education sector, as that is the only way through which the country can move forward."

Omole submitted that for universities to be responsive, there is a need for a paradigm shift in the nation's educational system.

Meanwhile, no fewer than 634 students of the Ondo State-owned University of Medical Sciences (UNIMED), Ondo, will graduate from the institution on Thursday.

Briefing newsmen at a pre-convocation press conference, the Vice-Chancellor of the university, Prof. Adesegun Fatusi, disclosed that the graduands are from various departments of the university.

He revealed that 539 students shall graduate from the first degree programmes, while 95 shall graduate from the postgraduate programmes.

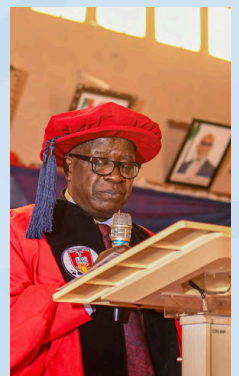

He explained that those with unclassified degrees include 41 medical doctors, 23 dental surgeons, and 64 physiotherapists.

He further disclosed that the university's first Ph.D. graduate, Sunday Olarewaju, will receive his degree at the convocation ceremony, which will take place at the university's main campus on Thursday.

# UNIMED TRAINS 32 FIRST EMERGENCY MEDICAL RESPONDERS

**... Now accredited as a training site for basic life support training of America Heart Association**

The University of Medical Sciences (UNIMED), Ondo trained 32 First Emergency Medical Responders between Tuesday, 10th December, 2024 and Friday, 13th December, 2024 at Laje Campus of the University.

According to the Vice-Chancellor, Professor Adesegun Fatusi, “The First Emergency Medical Responders training is an initiative of the University aimed at empowering participants with life-saving skills and demonstrates the institution’s commitment to community health and preparedness.” He further said that preparatory to opening up the training to the public and proper certification of trainees as professionals, “UNIMED has been internationally accredited as a training site for Basic Life Support training”. To this end, the Vice-Chancellor said “the University is now strategically positioned to help stem avoidable deaths often occasioned

by lack of emergency medical responses on Nigeria’s highways through cutting-edge knowledge”.

The first emergency medical responders training held last week, according to Professor Akingbola, the lead instructor from the United States of America, was to “enhance participants' understanding of common medical emergencies equip participants with basic life support skills, including cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) and the use of automated external defibrillators (AEDs), improve participants' ability to manage bleeding, shock, and other critical injuries, and foster a sense of community responsibility and preparedness”.

The Chairman, Ondo State Hospital Management Board, Dr. Fazoranti, accompanied by the Permanent Secretary, Dr. Ayodele Adiji at the closing of the training, commended the University for the initiative and appreciated Professor Akingbola for his patriotic commitment.

He went further to say that “government is ready to encourage all initiatives that will improve healthcare delivery in Ondo State”. The training programme incorporated a blended learning approach, combining, short video lectures with practical demonstrations and hands-on simulations, and had in attendance police officers, security men, teachers and ambulance drivers.
