HNW WE CAN WIN THE WAR AGAINST PARASITES – DON

A Professor of Parasitology and Medicine, Ovetunde Tropical Timothy Oyeyemi has asserted that man can win the war against parasites if we can and innovate, collaborate educate by dismantling the barriers of misinformation, strengthen healthcare systems and champion the integration of science into policy.

Ovetunde Oyeyemi, Professor who made this claim at the 10th Inaugural Lecture of the University of Medical Sciences (UNIMED), Ondo, on Tuesday, 25th February, 2025, described "the parasites as silent adversaries of human health which have long thrived in the shadows, infiltrating lives and detection". Не said eluding science has been relentless in putting an end to it. According to "through him, dedicated research, we have learned to decode their patterns, understand their biology and anticipate their strategies".



He added that "with every antigen profiled, every diagnostic tool developed, and every parasitehost interaction elucidated, we move one step closer to tipping the scales in favour of human health"

Oyeyemi, whose inaugural lecture topic was "Webs of Affliction, Hope: Unravelling Thread of Parasites, Patterns, and Pathways to Health", called for concerted efforts from all and sundry to win the war against the affliction of parasites. In his words, "Let us together be the generation that loosens the grip of parasites on human health. Let us be the architects of a future where science and society walk hand in hand toward a horizon free of neglected topical diseases".


2025 UTME REGISTRATION: WE ARE ONDO STATE UNIVERSITY OF MEDICAL SCIENCES IN JAMB BROCHURE

The University of Medical Sciences (UNIMED), Ondo has been inundated with calls over the confusion about the name to look out for in the Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board brochure for the 2025 UTME registration.

While the law establishing the University as amended and passed in December 2024 recognises the institution as "University of Medical Sciences (UNIMED), Ondo", it is yet to be effected in the brochure of JAMB.

According to the Admission Officer of the University, Ms. Olufunbi Ladapo " Candidates, parents and guardians of wards who are currently registering for the 2025 UTME and are willing to apply to UNIMED, Ondo should look out for 'Ondo State University of Medical Sciences' on the JAMB platform as "UNIMED' is not yet on the platform ".

This information is to ensure that no candidate is deprived of gaining admission to the University of Medical Sciences, Ondo.

UNIMED TO HOLD 10TH MATRICULATION IN MARCH 2025

The University of Medical Sciences (UNIMED), Ondo, will hold its 10th Matriculation Ceremony on Wednesday, 5th March, 2025 at the Main Auditorium, Odosida Campus of the institution.

In a release signed on behalf of the Registrar by Mr Akinola Oke, Principal Assistant О. Registrar (Academic Affairs), matriculation the will be batches. conducted in According to him, The first batch will include Faculties of Sciences, Allied Health Medical Rehabilitation, and Pharmacy; the second batch comprise Faculties will of Medical Basic Sciences, Clinical Sciences, and the School of Public Health; and the third batch will compose of Faculties of Basic Clinical Sciences, Dental Sciences, Nursing Science, and Science." The time for the matriculation shall be 9am, 11am and 1pm respectively for the three batches.



Speaking further, Mr Oke said "The list of candidates who are eligible for matriculation in the 2024/2025 Academic Session as approved by the Admissions Joint and (JAMB) Matriculation Board will be forwarded to each faculty on or before Monday, 25th February, 2025." He then added that "that anyone whose name does not appear on the list forwarded to the faculties is not eligible for matriculation".
