The gesture was part of the activities used to commemorate the 2025 World Hearing Day. The occasion was used to sensitise the public on the need for proper ear care.



# MARCH 24TH IS WORLD TUBERCULOSIS DAY


World Tuberculosis Day focuses on a global challenge that affects millions every year. The day marks the anniversary of Dr. Robert Koch's groundbreaking discovery of the bacterium causing tuberculosis (TB).

It's a day that brings people together, raising awareness about the impact of TB and the ongoing efforts to beat it.

Think of it as a reminder that, despite advances in medicine, TB still poses a significant threat, especially in parts of the world with limited access to healthcare!



#### TAKE CARE OF YOUR EARS



HOW THE EAR WORKS: The mechanism of hearing involved some processes that take place before we can hear sound. The sound we hear is transmitted as wave to the outer ear. Then this sound wave pass through the ear canal before striking the eardrum. From the eardrum, it vibrates the three small bones in the middle ear called the ossicles. These small bones are responsible for amplifying the vibrations and sending them to the cochlea. Then nerve impulses are sent from the cochlea to the auditory cortex, where sound is recognized and interpreted.

#### BASIC CAUSES OF HEARING LOSS.

Some common causes of hearing loss are: impacted wax, foreign body in the ear, infections, trauma, noise, some antibiotics/ototoxic medications, ageing etc.

#### BASIC FACTS ABOUT YOUR EARS.

- 1.Do you know that your ear is as important as your eyes?
- Do you know that when you don't take good care of your ears, you might lose your hearing? Do you know that hearing loss can happen to anyone and at any age?
- Do you know that the ear is a self cleansing organ?
- 5.Do you know that more than 8.5 million Nigerians have hearing loss?
- Do you know that there are professionals that treat ear/ hearing disorders in


